~ Romans 8:38-39

Paul admonishes us to put off many things in the Book of Ephesians.

Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, but put away from you with all malice.

~ Ephesians 4:31

And then he follows this verse with some things that we must put on:

And be kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

~ Ephesians 4:32

That's right, He wants us to be tenderhearted and forgiving one another as He forgave us. This is the key – we have to forgive in order to love deeply. Loving deeply does not come natural to us as humans. This level of love only comes from our Father. It is easy to love someone who has never hurt you but it's a different story when you have been hurt or disappointed by someone or even worse, they have left a scar on your life.

Its when we can fully understand the statement of Jesus at the cross, "Father forgive them, they know not what they do", that we are able to move on and love freely again. To love freely is love unconditionally, to love freely is to love deeply and without abandon.

So today as Woman of Grace, let us learn to let go, allow God to heal, walk in the newness of life, and be a light that radiates this deep form of love that only comes from above.

Prayer Bag Instructions..
